A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE MATCHING FUNDS FOR GRANT APPLICATIONS TO EXPAND BROADBAND AVAILABILITY TO CITIZENS OF McMINN COUNTY

WHEREAS, due to the increasing dependence on broadband accessibility for quality of life, economic development, and online education, the McMinn County Commission has listed the increased availability of broadband as a priority at their annual strategic planning session; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that funding will be available from the American Recovery Plan and other Federal and state programs for utility districts and communication companies for broadband expansion in rural areas; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County is served by numerous utility and private communication companies that provide broad band services; and

WHEREAS, grant applications are strengthened considerably when the local governments pledge a financial contribution; and

WHEREAS, this Commission, in its desire to promote the expansion of fiber throughout the county, pledges financial assistance to successful grant applicants as selected by the State of Tennessee in an amount ranging from ten percent (10%) to a maximum of thirty percent (30%) with said amount to be determined by size and scope of the project; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County's match would be sourced from the portion of funds it received from the American Rescue Plan with total aggregate amount not to exceed three million dollars (\$3,000.000); and

WHEREAS, future participation on broadband expansion projects will be based on case-by-case basis and the availability of funds; and

B. <u>A Resolution to Amend the McMinn County Subdivision Regulations to Change the Requirements for Private Roads and Private Ingress/Egerss Easements in McMinn County, Tennessee.</u>

RESOLUTION NO. 22-017

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE McMINN COUNTY SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS TO CHANGE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PRIVATE ROADS AND PRIVATE INGRESS/EGRESS EASEMENTS IN MCMINN COUNTY, TENNESSEE

- WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 13-3-402, the McMinn County Regional Planning Commission has adopted subdivision regulations for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, convenience, order, prosperity, and general welfare of the citizens of McMinn County; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 13-3-403, the McMinn County Regional Planning Commission desires to amend the adopted Subdivision Regulations; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 13-3-411(b), the McMinn County Regional Planning Commission has recommended these changes to the McMinn County Commission for adoption and incorporation in the McMinn County Subdivision Regulations, and were approved by the McMinn County Commission in February 2022;
- WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 13-3-403(c), a public hearing was held before this body;
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the McMinn County Commission that the Private Road Standards in the Subdivision Regulations for McMinn County, Tennessee be amended as described herein:

SECTION 1

Section 5.08.h and 5.08.i Requirements for Permanent Vehicular Easements shall be amended by deleting this section and replacing is as follows:

Delete:

<u>Section 5.08.</u> Requirements for Permanent Vehicular Easements. A permanent easement may be permitted under certain conditions. These easements shall meet the following minimum requirements and any special conditions attached by the Planning Commission, and the requirements and special conditions for the easement shall be placed on the final plat for recording.

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(Res. 017 con't)

- h. The McMinn County Regional Planning Commission shall require engineering and/or design plans for roads serving three (3) or more lots to ensure the road is constructed in such a manner that it will be safe, provide adequate drainage, and meet the requirements set forth in these regulations.
- i. All private roads shall obtain a road name from the McMinn County 911 Office, and a stop sign and street name sign(s) shall be installed at the intersection of all roadways to identify them for emergency services. Street signs shall be permanently mounted with reflective lettering. Proof of the installed signs (i.e. pictures) shall be presented to the Planning Commission prior to receiving approval of a final plat.

Replace:

<u>Section 5.08.</u> Requirements for Permanent Vehicular Easements & Private Roads. A permanent easement or private road may be permitted under certain conditions. It shall meet the following minimum requirements, including any special conditions attached by the Planning Commission, and the requirements and special conditions for the easement or private road shall be placed on the final plat for recording.

h. The McMinn County Regional Planning Commission may require engineering and/or design plans for roads serving three (3) or more lots to ensure the road is constructed in such a manner that it will be safe, provide adequate drainage, and meet the requirements set forth in these regulations.

All engineered plans shall meet highway commissioner's requirements.

i. All private roads in subdivisions containing 6 or greater lots shall obtain a road name from the McMinn County 911 Office, and a stop sign and street name sign(s) shall be installed at the intersection of all roadways to identify them for emergency services. Street signs shall be permanently mounted with reflective lettering. All private street signs shall be marked with "PVT" along the righthand side and highlighted yellow to indicate it as a private road. Proof of the installed signs (i.e. pictures) shall be presented to the Planning Commission prior to receiving approval of a final plat.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that on this day, the McMinn

County Commission hereby adopts this resolution amending the McMinn County Subdivision Regulations, the public welfare requiring it. Amendments shall become effective upon the approval of the McMinn County Commission.

WHEREAS, the duties of judicial commissioners are to issue arrest warrants upon a finding of probable cause, to set bonds and recognizances included in a "first appearance" before a magistrate, and to issue mittimus for persons to be held at the county jail; and

WHEREAS, the continued utilization of judicial commissioners is essential to provide due process to the citizens of McMinn County, as well as to strengthen criminal cases prepared by law enforcement of officers; and

WHEREAS, the McMinn County Board of Commissioners appoint Pamela Taylor to complete the term of Richard Brogan ending June 30, 2025, subject to proper training by the general sessions judge and circuit court clerk; and

WHEREAS, the judicial commissioners rotate weekly call and be compensated at the rate of four hundred dollars per week of called duty with any future compensation increases to be determined by the McMinn County Commission.
