A RESOLUTION TO CONFIRM THE APPOINTMENT OF DAN EARLY AS A JUDICIAL COMMISSIONER FOR MCMINN COUNTY

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 40-5-201 authorizes county legislative bodies to appoint judicial commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the duties of judicial commissioners are to issue arrest warrants upon a finding of probable cause, to set bonds and recognizances included in a "first appearance" before a magistrate, and to issue mittimus for persons to be held at the county jail; and

WHEREAS, the continued utilization of judicial commissioners is essential to provide due process to the citizens of McMinn County, as well as to strengthen criminal cases prepared by law enforcement of officers; and

WHEREAS, the McMinn County Board of Commissioners appoints Dan Early as judicial commissioner to a four-year term, subject to proper training by the general sessions judge and circuit court clerk; and

WHEREAS, the judicial commissioners rotate weekly call and be compensated at the rate of four hundred thirty-two dollars per week of called duty with any future compensation increases to be determined by the McMinn County Commission.
