WHEREAS, the McMinn County Commission recognizes the recruitment of new industry is highly competitive and it is imperative our industrial properties are site ready; and

WHEREAS, the McMinn County Commission has ranked the site preparation of its industrial parks as a funding priority during its annual strategic planning sessions; and

WHEREAS, the Appalachian Regional Commission has approved the State of Tennessee's recommendation to fund industrial park site improvements at the Mt Verd Industrial Park in the amount of one million dollars; and

WHEREAS, McMinn County agrees to provide half of the one million dollar match from its 189 Capital Fund and hotel/motel fund, dedicated to industrial land development, with the remaining five hundred thousand match provided by the City of Athens; and

WHEREAS, the County Mayor is authorized to execute all documents related to the execution and administration of the grant and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF McMINN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, MEETING IN REGULAR SESSION THIS THE 8th DAY OF JANUARY 2024 that this Commission does hereby agree to provide half of the match (\$500,000) for the Appalachian Regional Commission grant to provide site development improvements at the Mt. Verd Industrial Park.

A RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT TDOT DIVISION OF AERONAUTICS GRANT FOR RUNWAY LIGHTING REPLACEMENT SYSTEM AT McMINN COUNTY AIRPORT

WHEREAS, the McMinn County Airport is in need of upgrades to its runway lighting system; and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain a safe robust general aviation system the Tennessee Aeronautics division has approved a grant for the new runway lighting systems; and

WHEREAS, this project is for the construction of a new Runway Lighting Replacement System and will also include construction inspection and construction Administration.

WHEREAS, Division of Aeronautics has approved a grant in the amount of \$572,850 with a local match of \$30,150 for a total project cost of \$603,000.

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee Division of Aeronautics required the project to be let for bid before final grant approval, and the winning bidder was Guardian Electric for \$513,778; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF McMINN COUNTY, TENNESSEE MEETING IN REGULAR SESSION THIS THE 8th DAY OF JANUARY 2024, that this Commission does hereby approve the grant contract with the Tennessee Division of Aeronautics for new runway lighting system at the McMinn County Airport and authorizes the County Mayor to execute the documents necessary to fulfill the intent of this resolution.

C. <u>A Resolution to Amend the McMinn County Subdivision Regulations to Change the Requirements for Private Roads and Easements in McMinn County, Tennessee.</u>

(Res. # 24-004 con't)

RESOLUTION NO. 24-004

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE MCMINN COUNTY SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS TO CHANGE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PRIVATE ROADS AND EASEMENTS IN MCMINN COUNTY, TENNESSEE

- WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 13-3-402, the McMinn County Regional Planning Commission has adopted subdivision regulations for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, convenience, order, prosperity, and general welfare of the citizens of McMinn County; and
- WHEREAS, the McMinn County Regional Planning Commission's Subdivision

 Regulations regulate the construction, material, and lot requirements for public and private roads; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 13-3-403, in October of 2023 the McMinn County Regional Planning Commission recommended changes to the Subdivision Regulations pertaining to private road standards; and
- WHEREAS, the Planning Commission wishes to have these standards reviewed and approved by the County Commission prior to adoption of new subdivision regulations.
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the McMinn County Commission that Section 5.08 in the Subdivision Regulations for McMinn County, Tennessee be amended as described herein:
- SECTION 1 Language in Section 5.08 shall be deleted and replaced with the following for better clarity and understanding as well as addressing continued issues:
- Section 5.08. Requirements for Permanent Vehicular Easements & Private Roads.

A permanent easement or private road may be permitted under certain conditions.

It shall meet the following minimum requirements, including any special conditions attached by the Planning Commission, and the requirements and special conditions for the easement or private road shall be placed on the final plat for recording.

The following standards shall apply to all private easements and/or private roads based on the numbers of lots the private access will serve (current or future). The use of flag lots is not intended to abrogate standard subdivision development when it is feasible to construct required roads.

However, if the property is to be further subdivided in the future the easement or private road must be upgraded to meet the requirements below based on the total

number of individual lots that use this non-public access as a means of primary ingress/egress to these properties. Improvements must be made between the public right-of-way and the lot requiring the improvement. The cost of the improvements shall be incurred by the property owner and a new maintenance agreement between all parties involved must be established.

A lot that has at least fifty (50') feet of road frontage on publicly maintained road, for which the fifty (50') feet of frontage is not located underneath a deeded easement/ROW, shall not count toward the number of lots considered to be using the private access when determining which of the standards below must be met.

Exceptions to the fifty (50') feet lot frontage requirement may be waived by the Planning Commission for flag lots of one (1) acre or less that meet the minimum flag lot width requirements.

The number of lots the easement serves will be based on the total number of lots with access to the easement. The total number of lots accessing the easement will be determined by the Planning Commission and or the Highway Commissioner.

For the purpose of this section, "access" will be defined as any property (separate parcel) that utilizes the easement as its primary access.

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(Res. # 24-004 con't)

Access that will serve no more than a maximum of two (2) lots shall only be required to have a fifty (50') feet wide right-of-way or deeded easement upon which each lot served must front on the right-of-way or easement by at least fifty (50') feet.

However, in no case shall a flag lot have a flag stem that is less than the minimum easement width if the access strip connects to the end of a private easement.

The Planning Commission may allow an access easement rather than a dedicated right-ofway and in such cases, shall have the authority to set conditions on the easement and special statements to be listed on the plat. However, in no case shall the required rightof-way or permitted easement be less than fifty (50') feet in width.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF MCMINN COUNTY TENNESSEE, MEETING IN REGULAR SESSION THIS THE 8TH DAY OF JANUARY, 2024 that this Commission hereby adopts this resolution, the public welfare requiring it. Amendments shall become effective upon the approval of the McMinn County Regional Planning Commission after a public hearing has been held with 30 days notice given in a newspaper of general circulation.

A RESOLUTION TO RECOGNIZING THE HISTORICAL IMPORTANCE OF SAULPAW MILL DAM IN CALHOUN, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Valley Authority is considering the potential removal of Saulpaw Dam; and

WHEREAS, the Saulpaw Mill Dam has been a structure of historical significance to the City of Calhoun, McMinn County, and the surrounding region for 154 years; and

Mr. Gentry said they have submitted a pre-ap to see if they will invite us to make full application.

- Bicentennial Park we did get the LPRF Grant to do one of the fields and were notified a couple weeks ago that they got the CBDG Grant that was applied for the other field. Mr. Gentry said the beauty of the grant it is pledged a 50/50 match on the LPRF Grant and the CBDG Grant provides the match on the LPRF Grant and this could be a substantial savings to the county by putting both grants together. He said \$600,000 to do both fields and the exciting thing is saving \$600,000 match to free up for other projects.
- Woods Foundation has met and they have put out for applications for their next round. Those are due January 31st and those will come back before this commission for approval. He said they are kind of testing the waters to see what is out there and Scott's on that committee and the Opioid Council is going to react quickly in the spring with some new settlement news and new programs that we might be eligible for. Mr. Gentry said he has spoken with several different agencies, he talked to Melissa with Juvenile Services on what they are looking for. He talked to the Sheriff on some things with the jail, he also talked to the administrator from the hospital so when they come together, they will have a lot of information.
- County Government Day is February 18-19 which will be normal County Commission meeting night and will need to schedule the meeting on another day. He said he got a text from Beth Jones that she would be available for the Annual Planning Session on March 1st at the Etowah Depot.
- Mayor Gentry turned the meeting over to Chairman Curtis to schedule a date for February County Commission meeting. After discussion it was decide the February meeting would be February 12, 2024 at 12:00 pm.
